### Worksheet 4: Australia then and now

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Use the 'ABC World War 1: Snapshot of Australia at the time of the outbreak' web page to find out some facts about your topic area. Then use the Internet to search for the same facts about life today or use the facts your teacher will give you.

<b>Fact</b> <i>For example: People went shopping in stores such as Mark Foy's in Sydney.</i>	<b>Describe how life today is different</b> <i>For example: The main department stores are Myer and David Jones but you can buy anything you want online.</i>

## **Reflections**

How is your topic different today compared to 1914?

What is good about the changes to your topic?

If you had to go back into the past, what would you find annoying or frustrating about your topic and why?

Do you think people in the past would have felt the same as you? Why, or why not?

## **Presentation**

Now you need to turn each 'Then and Now' fact into a presentation slide! You could either use PowerPoint or Prezi to do this.

Your presentation should include:

- title slide
- three or four slides (one slide for each fact) which compare how each fact has changed between 1914 and today
- one slide that compares the overall changes in the whole topic between the past and today
- one slide that explains why these changes are a good thing
- one slide that explains what people in the past might have thought and felt about your topic

If you would like to add photos linked to each fact to make your slides more interesting, do a Google Images search for your topic then add the date 1914 and the word Australia (for example, telephone 1914 Australia)
