

## Worksheet 8: Text and image analysis, *The Beach They Called Gallipoli*

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Using *The Beach They Called Gallipoli*, identify, analyse and explain all the different types of text and image which combine to provide information about the Gallipoli campaign.

This worksheet will help you to complete the activity. Some information has been filled in already. Before you start, read the following information to help you understand what you need to do:

- Purpose: think about the purpose of each text or image. Is it to *inform*, *entertain* or *persuade*? Or is a combination of two such as to inform and entertain, or entertain and persuade?
- Features: identify the features of the text or image. You should think about whether they are factual or fictional, explain how the text is formatted and how and why the images are different to all the other images.
- What type of information does it provide? You will have to think about what kinds of information the text or image reveals and explain what this information helps the reader to understand about the Gallipoli campaign.

### Dates

Purpose: *inform*
